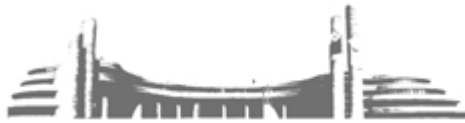

York Region begins offering H1N1 flu vaccine to all residents

Beginning Wednesday, November 18th, The Regional Municipality of York will begin immunizing all residents over the age of six months who want and need protection

NEWMARKET –The Regional Municipality of York has expanded the eligibility for the H1N1 flu vaccine. Effective Wednesday, November 18th, the H1N1 flu vaccine will be available to all York Region residents (over the age of six months) who need and want protection from the H1N1 flu virus.

“In response to the needs of our community, starting tomorrow, we will begin immunizing anyone who wants and needs an H1N1 flu vaccination,” said Dr. Karim Kurji, York Region’s Medical Officer of Health. “We have started to receive a steady supply of vaccine from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care and I am confident we will be able to meet the public demand for immunization against the H1N1 flu virus.”

Influenza-like illnesses, like seasonal flu viruses and the H1N1 flu virus, are caused by viruses that are easy to catch and easy to spread. Symptoms include a headache, muscle aches, cough, sore throat, fever, fatigue and weakness.

York Region community H1N1 immunization clinics are also offering unadjuvanted vaccine to pregnant women only. Both adjuvanted and unadjuvanted H1N1 flu vaccines may also be available from participating family doctors. Communication will be forwarded to participating physicians regarding the expanded eligibility, providing residents another opportunity to receive their vaccination.

Most York Region community H1N1 flu shot clinics operate seven days a week and are scheduled to run until Friday, December 18th.
